ANNUAL PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES - 04.12.15

Amazing pole vault performance by Sue Yeomans Two trophies for Liz Sissons

The evening this year at the Victory Services Club near Marble Arch had the best ever attendance by trophy winners. Eleven trophies were to be presented and nine athletes were able

to make the journey to London to receive them personally. The meeting had the added bonus



that Tom Phillips was a trophy winner and also available to take professional standard photos.

There are eight Tom Woods memorial trophies for best performances in the outdoor championships and age graded tables are used to decide on the winners. W60 Helen Godsell took the women's sprint trophy for her 100m. in 14.65, 93.31%, while Tom Phillips scored 89.86% for his 13.10 100m. just edging out Bob Lewis, M50, who scored 88.53% for his 26.03 200m. Diana Norman, who had recently broken the W40 world pentathlon record by almost 300 points,

took the women's distance trophy for her 2:17.87 800m, and M60 Paul Gasson the men's trophy for his 2:29.7 800m, 84.99%. The jumps trophies were both high jump performances, by Emily McMahon, W65, for 1.15, 85.10%, and Gary Capon, M55, for his 1.57, 82.97%. M65 Tony Richards, took the men's throws trophy with a shot performance of 10.90, 69.39%, while W70 Liz Sissons, for her 8.83, 82.83%, in the same event, took two trophies, for best female thrower and the Norman Martin memorial trophy for the best over 70 performance by a man or woman in any event in the championships.

There are two trophies that are memorials to Jim Day, a very talented pole vaulter and past chairman of SCVAC. The first is awarded for the best pole vault performance over the whole year and W60 Sue Yeomans, with her European record of 2.91, scored an amazing 103.56%. The second celebrates the best performance at the SCVAC 10k. championship, the Ted Pepper Memorial race, and is to remember Jim's hard work at the race for many years. M70 Michael Conway's 48:46, 79.42%, won him the trophy.



EAMA INTER AREA CHALLENGE SOLIHULL 17th July 2015

World record for Angela Copson

Eight area clubs competed and in an unprecedented finish SCVAC won the men's match, MMAC won the women's match and the combined match was tied with both clubs on 605 points. The outstanding performance of the day came from MMAC athlete Angela Copson, who clocked 5:54.59 to break the world W65 one mile record and become the first woman over 65 to get under six minutes.

SCVAC won the men's match with 315 points, beating MMAC into second place on 305. M35 Peter Davey got SCVAC off to a good start on the track, winning the 110m. hurdles in 16.79, Joshua Wood, also M35, scored a fine double, taking the 100m. in 11.24 and 200m. in 22.97, while M60 Dave Wilcock was a triple winner, 800m. in 2:21.72, one mile in 5:15.60, and 400m. in 60.75. M50 Chris Hobbs easily won the 2000m. walk with 9:48.04. SCVAC also won three of the 4x100m. relays, M35, 44.47, M60, 56.10 and M70, 59.85.

M50 Allan Leiper's sterling work in six events, including three second places, 100m. hurdles.17.61, discus, 39.04 and pole vault, 3.30 made him the highest points scorer in the men's and overall matches with 30 points, closely followed by Dave Wilcock on 29.

The women's match was won by MMAC, 300 points, beating SCVAC on 290 into second place. On the track the top sprint performance came from W60 Helen Godsell's two victories, 200m. in 30.54 and 400m. in 72.89, while W50 Alison Collins took the W50 400m. in 65.14. Julie Briggs won the W35 3000m. with 10:27.96 and the W60 team took the 4x100 relay in 64.61. SCVAC had more successes in the field, W60 Sue Yeomans vaulting 2.60 and W50 Teresa Eades' triple jump with 8.89. In the throws Sue Dassie took the W60 shot with 8.18 and Liz Sissons the W70 with 8.91, while W50 Julie Wilson won the discus, 27.50.

Again there was a close contest for top points scorer, again with a one point difference, Teresa Eades on 26 and Louise Oliver on 25. Teresa added to her triple jump a second place in the high jump, 1.30, a third place in the 80m. hurdles, 17.06 and fourth in the long jump, 4.04. W35 Louise Oliver scored one second place, high jump. 1.35 and three thirds, 80m. hurdles, 14.66, javelin, 25.96 and shot, 10.04.

SCVAC LEAGUE FINAL – ASHFORD – 06.09.15

This year four clubs had both their men's and women's teams qualify for the final: Abingdon, Dartford Harriers, Epsom and Ewell and Herne Hill Harriers and the match, as usual, was very competitive. In the men's match Herne Hill pulled away rapidly in the final stages to win quite easily from Cambridge Harriers, last year's champions – 231 points to 207.

In the M35 races Herne Hill's Simon Coombes took both the 1500m. and 3000m. in 4:15.60 and 9:05.69 respectively, with Gary Ironmonger taking the M50 3000m. in 10:10.21. In the field M35 Stuart Thurgood won a throws double, shot, 11.76 and hammer, 48.81, while M50 Garry Power won the discus, 42.62.

Cambridge Harriers did well in the jumps: M35 Francois Potgieter with a triple victory in high jump, 1.65, long jump, 5.72 and triple jump, 12.00, while Tim Carter took the M60 long jump with 3.74. In the throws, M50 Tony Tipping scored a double win, in the shot, 11.76 and the hammer, 41.30, as did M60 Peter Hawney, winning shot with 9.46 and discus with 31.05. Southampton's Mark Collins claimed a sprint double in the M35 races, 100m, 11.63 and 200m. 23.49, as did M50 Steve Beak, 12.10 and 24.68. M50 John Tilt won the 400m. in a fast 55.66 and the 800m. in 2:12.62. Not surprisingly with their array of sprinting talent, Southampton won both relays, 4x100m, 48.38, and 4x400m, 3:46.62. Barnet and District's M60 Dave Wilcock scored quadruple victories, 100m, 13.87, 400m, 61.1, 800m, 2:25.38 and 3000m, 11:09.71, while Andy Neatham, also M60, took the 1500m, 4:39.40. Steve Allen won the 2000m. walk in 10:21.34.

M50 Gary Capon won three events for Dartford Harriers, high jump, 1.55, long jump, 4.97 and triple jump, 10.56, while team mate John Fenton won the M50 javelin, 42.03 and Craig Sharp won the M35 800m. with a fast 2:02.30. Abingdon won three events, M60 Duncan Talbot with a 1.40 high jump, Mark Spivey, M50, a 3.20 pole vault and M35 Jose Phillips a 42.82 javelin. Epsom and Ewell had two winners, M35 Dan Donovan with a 53.74 400m, and M50 John Andrews won the M35 pole vault with 3.70.

In the women's match Epsom and Ewell won by a larger margin, 245 to 197, from Dartford Harriers to record their seventh successive victory. The club had only two winners in the sprints, Angela Bates, 100m. in 13.72 in the W35 race and Diana Norman in the W35 400m, 60.75. Diana added the 800m. in 2:19.60, Vanda Caulfield won the W60 1500m. in 5:52.41 and W65 Jane Davies, in the W50 race, ran a 12:18.34 3000m. In the field the club were dominant, particularly thanks to sisters Julia Machin and Diana Norman. Julia won the W35 high jump with 1.40 and the shot with 9.97, while Diana took the javelin, 32.69 to add to her

Barns Green Half Marathon – A Personal Account by Dave Kemp

Barns Green was my first event entered with SVAC. My home club is Arena 80. I am 56 and have been running since I was 51 starting at Hove Park Run. I have since become very committed amidst the normal restrictions of life and run numerous races of all types from 5K upwards with 10 Marathons under my belt (best time being Warsaw 2014 in 3:21:59). I have been training fairly hard for the Munich Marathon next week-end (Oct 11th) and I have it in mind to get under 3:20 which is my Good For Age time. My thinking was that Barns Green would be a good test of my fitness. It was my Half Marathon PB Course from two years ago.

Barns Green is a fantastic event, very well organised, with a friendly family atmosphere and running through some beautiful countryside. I was not intending to run too hard as my goal was two weeks on, but being in a race always triggers my competitive edge and I settled into somewhere around my target Half Marathon pace. Being an 'undulating' course the pace was always going to fluctuate, so I was not sure how well I was doing against the clock, but by the end I was still feeling good in an almost exhausted sort of way and could still manage a sprint for the line. I narrowly beat Tara Shanahan, another Arena 80 / SCVAC runner, by a tiny margin but I have since apologised for being so impolite!

At this point it needs to be pointed out that I have never won any Athletics race in my life apart from a relay race when I was about 11 years old. It never even crossed my mind therefore that I might have achieved any kind of mention in the medals. I was more than happy with my silver from finishing 126th and getting a new PB of 1:34:52. I had been given a lift and my friends needed to leave promptly. I was astonished later on to get a text from a friend to say that I had won a medal for my age group in the SCVAC category for my age group - and a gold at that! I am sorry I wasn't there but Tara accepted it on my behalf, appropriately enough. Thank you very much and I am sorry I wasn't there myself. I hope to participate again soon, but I just need to get Munich out the way for now.
