SCVAC 10 Mile Championships.

On the 4^{th} December the SCVAC 10 Mile Championship was held as part of the Alan Green Memorial 10 mile race in Thanet. It's a flat, traffic free out and back course meaning that fast times are possible as long as the wind stays away. On the day it was dry and overcast but we did have a reasonable tail wind on the 1^{st} half and headwind on the 2^{nd} half meaning that most runners were a couple of minutes slower in the 2^{nd} half.

16 Athletes took part across 11 age categories.

The most keenly contested were the M65 where Trevor Edgley won comfortably, but Peter Watts took a close silver just 45 seconds ahead of Barry Bell in bronze, and the W55 was even closer with all three medallists finishing within 4 minutes.

Age graded wise the performances were very good with many in the high 70s but the two stand out performances were:

Just as the runners set off the rain began to fall, adding to the fun of the slippery gully and the legendary downhill plummet. However, the village hall was warm and the cakes were excellent.

Both ladies and men set off together, the ladies running two laps of the park while the men ran three. Diana Norman ran a faster time than last year, when she won the race in 27m 05s. Considering that the conditions were not so good this year, an improvement of 23 seconds is a remarkable improvement.

Both races had a larger field than last year, which is encouraging for the organisers. This might explain why our first man home, Stuart Flack, was in 18th place, while last year's first man home was Mark Champion in 11th place.

A turnout of seven runners for the club was down on previous years and every runner was in a different age group! So there were gold medals all round and room for more medals to be sought including the collectors'

item of a bronze medal!

National recognition for Dianna Norman.

Di Norman is a familiar figure at SCVAC events rushing around the venue from one competition to anther and of course usually winning them! Similarly with national and European events, Di has dominated the multi-event scene in her W40 age group.

These performances have now been recognised by readers of Athletic Weekly. In the magazine's annual "Athletes of the Year" competition for 2017, Di was voted second in the masters category. The only athlete in front of her was the renown Joe Pavey, illustrious company indeed! (Athletics Weekly December 7th 2017).

Furthermore, reflecting the increased coverage the magazine is giving master's athletics, a whole page was recently (Athletics Weekly November 1th 2017) devoted to the achievements of the Epsom & Ewell athlete. Perhaps the highlight of her year was winning the European Masters W40 heptathlon title in July when she just missed out on a world record but set a new British record for the event. The article also recounted the exploits of

her six sisters (three of whom are GB internationals) and indeed her husband (an English international) and children who are already making their mark on the athletic scene.

Dianna is the current holder of the world W40 outdoor pentathlon record with 4249 points gained in September 2015 recording 12.53s for 100m hurdles, 1.64m high jump, 10.7m shot put throw, 5.33m long jump and 2.18.66 minutes for the 800m. (european-masters-athletics.org)

Closer to home she was recently awarded the inaugural "Brian Harlick Memorial Trophy" for the SCVAC athlete for the highest number of points awarded at the Veterans League Final held this year at the Julie Rose Stadium at Ashford. The Trophy was presented to her at the SCVAC AGM by our Treasurer Tom Richards, (see page 4.)

Summary of the minutes of the 2017 AGM, 1st December.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2017

TRACK AND FIELD LEAGUE

Around 60 clubs entered in the six divisions. The coordinators, host clubs and officials, all volunteers, worked hard to make the fixtures run smoothly, although there is still the perennial problem of some shortages of officials. In the final at Ashford, Epsom and Ewell women took the trophy for the ninth successive year and Southampton's men kept the trophy that they had won in 2016.

SCVAC CHAMPIONSHIPS

The indoor meeting at Lee Valley ran successfully attracting approaching 200 entries. The outdoor was combined with the VAC Championships at Kingsmeadow, but the large numbers of athletes from both clubs overloaded the timetable and VAC cannot continue to hold a combined championship.



EAMA INTER AREA MATCHES

SCVAC easily won the men's, women's and combined trophies at the indoor meeting at Lee Valley with a total of 448 points to EMAC's 404 in second place. At the outdoor meeting in Solihull MMAC won easily with SCVAC in third position, MMAC 646 points, SCVAC 483.5. SCVAC was second in the men's and third in the women's competition.

BMAF

The World Indoor Championships in Daegu, South Korea, attracted just over 100 British athletes, not surprising after the other long haul expensive trip to Perth, Australia, for the World Outdoor Championships in October/November 2016. The British team were placed second in the medals table.

The European Outdoor Championships in Aarhus, Denmark, were marred by rain on every competition day, in August! and in part by poor organisation and officiating. The British team were third in the medals table.

The British and Irish Masters Cross Country in Derry, Northern Ireland, was very successfully organised by Northern Ireland Masters and Derry City Spartans Athletic Club, commented on by many as one of the best ever of these annual fixtures.

Vince Wilson is doing an excellent job as distributor at a wide range of fixtures selling BMAF official kit produced by Ridgeway Textiles. They were not able to produce tracksuits, but we now have a new supplier, Kudos Sports, whose kit will be available in January.

BMAF/ATHLETICS WEEKLY PARTNERSHIP

Each month the BMAF can place a quarter page advertisement and send material for an editorial. This has been operating since July and has been very successful.

TREASURER'S REPORT

- SCVAC is in a healthy financial position, income from membership fees and donations is up on the previous financial year. "Donations" includes a number of old standing orders.
- The largest single item of expenses is The Southerner Magazine an extra copy was produced in 2017, but following the decision to publish online, the expenditure will reduce dramatically in 2018. Those members desiring a printed copy can pay Hon. Treasurer £10 by cheque.
- Owing to the difficulty in identifying payments via the Stripe payment system in Opentrack, Road Races show a fictitious loss. SCVAC retain a small amount (e.g. £2) from each online race entry via Opentrack, the balance being passed on to the race organiser.

Hon. Chairman proposed that SCVAC Life Members should be limited to 10 in number. David Beattie seconded this proposal, and the committee voted unanimously to adopt our Chairman's proposal.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- A draw was conducted for the club entry to the 2018 London Marathon. Debbie Hall was the lucky winner. David Beattie to email Debbie with the result of the draw, and send her the link to complete her details online.
- Roger Bruck proposed a vote of thanks to the committee for their work throughout the year. Ray Gibbins seconded this proposal.

Tony Rea submitted the following report on The Southerner, our club magazine.

"Following a decision made at last year's AGM, The Southerner moved from being sent out in hard copy to all members to being available in hard copy form only to those who subscribed for it. The magazine remained available in PDF form on the website with an additional feature of all members being sent a link via email.

We have 15 subscribers for the hard copy.

Each cost almost exactly £2.50 to produce and post which matches the £10 annual charge for four issues.

A form for additional subscribers has been posted on the website on the Southerner page.

The arrangement of posting a PDF copy on the Southerner web page, with an email link for all members via mail chimp, appears successful.

The quality of the PDF copy on the website appears satisfactory with some positive comments from members. The quality of some the photos in the hard copy is disappointing, a problem that I am working to address.

A big thank you to all those who have contributed articles and/or photos. Without these would be no magazine!


Colin Field, SCVAC athlete, publishes his memoires

You are one of our own

Run for your life at 80 is the title of my biography. I chose it as the title because the book is a recipe for a meaningful life and competing in sport, more especially Athletics, has been essential to that.

We cannot all amass a collection of Gold medals. I have more Silver and Bronzes than Golds at National, European and World level.

In the early days success in sprinting and Long Jump at school, university and Thames Valley Harriers was followed by a long spell playing Rugby until injury and age led me to turn to Marathons. In twelve years Marathons took me from Lands' End to Glasgow, from Athens to Berlin completing twenty four and countless Half Marathons and 10K's. Mostly the training was done alone until I joined Trent Park Running Club in the 1990's. By this roundabout route aged 60 I returned to the track, running for SCVAC and Great Britain during the last 20 years, winning the European 400M in 2003



and National titles at 100, 200, 400 and Long Jump.

Part of the fascination has been the travel, which has taken me to countries I would not have visited otherwise. Also, the countless friends especially around ones age group that one meets through Athletics. Like my professional work as a History teacher it has become a way of life which I have been able to carry on in retirement.

Though an Arsenal supporter I like the Tottenham crowds chant, "you are one of our own", in appreciation of Harry Kane. Though no superstar, I like to feel certainly in respect of persistence with a degree of talent, that it might apply to my running and my biography.
