Our Championships were again held at the Millenium Arena, Battersea Park on Sunday 13th June, 2004. The sun shone brightly, with only a few clouds drifting overhead. The outstanding performance of the day came from Vivien Bonner who sped round the track in a new W55 200 metres WORLD RECOD of 27.43. Further success came her way with a British Record 100 metres in 13.51. Congratulations to Vivien from the Committee of SCVAC on behalf of all Club Members. Plus Congratulations to all other competitors on their superb efforts in Track and Field.

Thanks are also due to all the Officials whose presence allowed us to hold the meeting. Owing to other events on at the same time, we were worried that we might have to cancel, but we went ahead, and the meeting appeared to us to be a great success. We took the decision to limit the field events to 4 rounds, in order not to overburden our hard pressed Field Officials and to enable the programme to be completed on time. We hope this did not upset the "Heavy Brigade" too much. M35's tooke part for the first time, and some impressive performances were witnessed. The news that this group is able to participate has not yet been widely circulated, but SCVAC appears to be to the fore in accommodating them in our events. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Chairman Jim Day and his wife Chris , Steve Connolly (Entries Secretary), Vilma Thompson, Pat Green and other Committee and Club Members who helped organise in advance, as well as keeping things going smoothly on the day.







SCVAC WEIGHT PENTATHLON CHAMPIONSHIPS Ewell, July 3rd 2004

SECTA exists to promote the throwing events and this year the aim was on persuading regional bodies like SCVAC to promote championships in such as the weight pentathlon. The first SECTA/SCVAC weight pentathlon attracted an entry of 28 quite above expectations. This augurs well for the future and no doubt this event will now be added to the annual calendar.

The emphasis in SECTA organised events is enjoyment and participation and this was much to the fore on July 3rd at Ewell. There is much banter and comment on technique, attitude and demeanour but that is very much part of the competition and the enjoyment and we would be all the poorere without the continual discourse.

The throwers were divided into three groups, younger men and women, middle age group men and the mature men. Although it was warm, the strong wind ensured fast moving clouds and the occasional burst of rain which frequently turned into a squall. Thus the conditions were not the ebst for throwing - yet the distances attained indicated otherwise which shows the calibre of the competition.

There was some excellent returns in the hammer - Steve White [M40] closing in on 60 metres and Mike Small [M50] and Chirs Melluish [M55] close on 50 metres. Steve and Mike were to the fore in the shot where Neil Griffin [M55] and Gordon Hickey [M70] were also prominent. Mike believed he should have done better than the commendable 13,72 metre best he posted. Steve meanwhile improved in every round and returned the exceptional mark of 16,04 metres - a figure that does justice to any senior men's shot competition in the country.

Some ten athletes threw the discus in excess of 35 metres with Steve, Mike and Neil again very much to the fore and whereas neither of the 3 managed to break the 50 metre mark, all came within a metre or two of that excellent mark. Good to see that John Gilbert - recently returned from Cyprus - had lost none of his technique and posted a useful best of 36,74 metres. The javelin is an event which few throwers - in particular the multi eveners - accomplish with any great success. On this occasion, Mike managed to stay on his feet throughout the event - he is a noted faller when throwing the javelin at Ewell! - and he duly returned the best mark of the day - 49,70 metres and so was still on target for a new British record. So too was Neil Griffin whose 42,82 metre throw kept him in contention to break national figures. Gordon Hickey was non too pleased with his 29 metre best but he too was on course for new British figures overall.

David Burrell [M40] posted a 41 metre plus javelin mark as did Steve Whyte whose sights were not alone set on a new M40 British weight pentathlon record but also a world record! Steve is a modest individual and he need to be on this occasion - his first attempt in the javelin was outside the sector. His second attempt was a foul - not the ideal situation for an overall potential record breaking attempt. In the best traditions of Daley Thompson in a somewhat different multi eventer, Steve shrugged his shoulders and posted a useful mark of 41,76 metres with the third round effort. The British record was still on but only the computer operator, Colm Murphy, knew whether the world record was still a possibility.

Thus to the final event - the heavy hammer; eight athletes over 14 metres, five of these over 15 metres. Peter Barber's 15,43 metres was the highlight of the M70 category but Gordon Hickey finished in style posting 14,21 metres and a final overall total of 4,013 pts - a new British record. Neil Griffin had the better of Chris Melluish on this occasion - 15,97 metres to 15,29 metres - Neil's final total of 4,332 pts was also a new British record. Mike Small enjoyed the best mark of the day in the event - a phenomenal 17,82 metres - and his overall points total of 4,266 was also a new British record.

And what of Steve Whyte and his attempts on British and world records; his first attempt with the heavy hammer was just over the 17 metre mark, his second attempt of 17,55 metres was a new British record for the event itself and his best of the day. And yes, he did break the British record for the weight pentathlon with a total of 4,133 points which, for the record, was some 200 points in excess of the world record!

Congratulations to all - everyone did well despite the unusual and unseasonable weather and it must be added that all the record breakers were modest about their performances - the important factors were taking part and being a part of the day's proceedings. The latter point may seem out of date in this day and age but nonetheless remains the central ethos of such events and such clubs as SECTA.



"THE ITINERANT ATHLETE": an extract from Stan Allen's newly published book, "If It's Tuesday It Must Be Tooting", an amusing collection of running anecdotes & observations.

I reckon that it is a good idea, this business of finding a country to run for which does not have strength-in-depth in a particular event. I mean, look at our sprinters, any of them could compete for, say, the Decammeron Islands. Old Jim Derham always said that he had been born in the wrong country and at the wrong time to get an international road running vest and I think that he did have a point.

Anyway, what I am trying to say is that it seems to be all changing now. All you have to do is find some tenuous link with another country and simply go for it. I mean look at the options available for myself.

My Mum was brought over by the Hugeknots from France at the time of the religious persecution. Well, not mother in person, obviously, but her family, the De Goldsberrys were, and that should give me a toe hold into the French National team. As a younger man I always thought that I stood a good chance until they started to plough money into French athletics and turned them into a team that produced some reasonable performances.

Then I started to look at my father who was a fine athlete in his own right. He served in Germany with the Royal Irish Rifles after one of the world wars and that should be good for two more nationalities. German and Irish. I don't really know if he was in East or West Germany but perhaps that doesn't matter any more. And I was an evacuee from the horrors of bomb torn London to Lincolnshire during the 39-45 conflict. I actually wrote to the Lincolnshire County AAA to tell them that I was ready to compete for the them in the intercounties but they never bothered to answer. But it does show what can be done. After all Roger's mother was Polish and so were Keith's and Fred's. If you think about it that is three legs in a relay team.

Which reminds me, I was talking to Geoff the other day about this problem of getting due recognition for our obvious talents. Forgetting for a moment the International kit and all those free trainers and spikes or even the money on the side, he said that he had been thinking about it a lot and decided that he would not want to run for any country that had lowered its standards to that extent!

Takes all sorts, I told him. I would have gone like a shot, not that I am very good at the shot as I get my head in the wrong position. But I was the first man at Tooting Bec Track to try that Russian technique in a Wednesday evening local league match. You know the one, the style where you turn round in smaller and smaller circles and more or less turn yourself inside out.

No, I've got it, the perfect answer to my problem of getting due recognition. I remember now. My second great Aunt Mabel once flew over Lichtensteen as a young girl and had to land with some sort of engine trouble. Well, anyway, she got on really well with some sort of Crown Prince Thingie and then flew home with temporary citizenship. Now this has never been revoked so I'll offer myself to Lichtensteen for a run in the Olympic half marathon. It's Chariots of Fire all over again.
