



He has been Chairman and Secretary for Croydon Harriers, was a President for the Surrey Cross Country League, and received a long service award for 30 + years working for the SEAA. Not only was he a most efficient Treasurer for the SCVAC, he also edited The Southerner magazine for many years along with Jack Fitzgerald. When I took over as editor, Ken always produced several pages, including Cross Country and Championships reports.



#### MRS DERRIEN'S DIARY by Carole Derrien (Jersey Spartan A.C.)




Things are a lot quieter in the house of Derrien:, no builders, plumbers, electricians -just the redesigned front garden to be dug out planted and a water feature to be bought. So I should have plenty of time to train and generally get on with things - but as usual, the fates decree that life should be as hectic as ever. I actually managed to get away to the Algarve and train under the watchful eye of Bron Carter; the weather, food and company were second to none. We caught up with the group at the Hampshire Championships, where I missed a lot of the action - busy looking after No 2 granddaughter whilst her father competed. Thankfully he got medals in all his events and a PB, so all was forgiven. He then informed me that I was "volunteered" as Field Referee for the forthcoming Southern League at Barnes, which was a smokescreen for- garden to organise, things to bring over, new showerhead to fix etc. as they had not long moved house! This year we were going to Rennes and cycling back along the banks of the River Rance - some 90 to 100 miles. #### **COME & JOIN US!**

With the Southern Vets Leagues in full swing, most of you have no doubt been very busy in recent weeks. From a Race Walking perspective, these leagues are excellent for introducing Walking to those who wouldn't otherwise have any contact with it whatsoever!

Race Walking is, in essence, a' Sport within a Sport', with our own Governing Body:- The Race Walking Association, and a full programme of Road Walks, week in, week out. Race Walkers themselves, are a pretty friendly bunch, as a general rule, and only to pleased to offer help & advice to a 'Newcomer'.

The Enfield League is a monthly series of 5 mile Walks, on a 1 mile circuit around a completely traffic free course in a local Playing Fields (so you can do 1, 2, 3, or 4 miles to start with, if you wish!) As such, it is a good introduction for Novice Walkers, and we have

seen several develop from 'Novice' to 'Front of the Field' over the years.

The Blackheath League (9kms Yacht Handicaps), serves the same purpose, and celebrates its 300th Race in September. One of their regulars in the early days of the league is now the Member of Parliament for Kettering, though I'm not sure that producing politicians was quite what the original organisers intended! 

5th WORLD THROWS CHAMPIONSHIPS - TATA, HUNGARY: 12<sup>th</sup> - 14<sup>th</sup> August 2005- a report from Barbara Dunsford.

Competitors came from Lithuania, Romania, Germany, Poland, Austria, and Great Britain and of course Hungary itself. SCVAC members made up 50% of the British ten -person team who travelled to Hungary to take part in this prestigious event.

There were twelve events for women, with an extra event for men, to be completed in two and a half days, with temperatures in the high 30's and mosquito's joining in the fun. It was hard work but all really enjoyed the experience, and came home with a large haul of medals. Two new events were added this year, the "Erwin Kollmar Ultra Stone Putt," in memory of the well-known organiser of throwing competitions. Kollmar was also a competitor of note. The "ultra stones" are boulders of various shapes, which make for an interesting competition!

The second new event was the Hammer Throw of "Igmand," -a similar piece of equipment is thrown in the Highland Games. The weight of the implement is 8 kg for women and 13kg for men.

Steve Archer M55, took three golds heaving the Ultra Stone 25 kg out to 5.01, the 50 kg implement to 3.40 and the 10kg Stone Putt to 9.69. He also took four silver medals in Historical Heavy Weight Throw, Hammer Throw of "Igmand', Shotorama (three throws of five different weight shots) Heavy Weight Throw (Hammer) and finished up with a bronze medal in the Weight Pentathlon.

The four representatives in the womens' competitions were Jenny Earle and Wendy Dunsford in the W45 age group, Rosemarie Alexander in the W55 and Barbara Dunsford in the W70 categories. There was some lively competition against women from Hungary & Germany, as they battled for the honours. Jenny and Wendy competed in all events with a total of

seventy one throws.

Jenny's results: five gold medals: Heavy Wt. Throw - 12.35, Wt. Pentathlon- 3516.92 pts., Javelin Biathlon-42.19 m., Grenade -25.59 and Hammer Throw of "Igmand" - 11.03 m. four silvers: Stone Putt (Brick)- 5.54, Heavy Wt. Triathlon - 48.68, Sling ball \_29.60, Ultra Stone Putt (25k) - 1.79 and 2 bronzes in the Shotorama - 31.43 and Schockorama - 33.54. She took 1st place in the Age Graded Overall in the Heavy Wt. Throw for which she received a special plate.

Wendy's results: two golds- Stone Putt (Brick) - 5.61, Ultra Stone Putt (25k)- 2.60. six silvers-Heavy Wt. Throw- 9.11, Javelin Biathlon - 34.95, Grenade 17.22, Hammer Throw of "Igmand" -10.58, Schockorama - 38.20, Shotorama - 35.27: three bronzes- Greek Discus-15.22, Sling ball - 27.77, Heavy Weight Triathlon- 43.82.

Rosemarie's results: three golds - Slingball-28.14,Stone Putt- 5.63, Heavy Wt. Throw10.73:three silvers - Wt. Pentathlon-2810.22 pts.,Heavy Wt. Triathlon with 61.35 pts., Hammer Throw of "Igmand" -9.15 m. Barbara's results:- silver in the Grenade -17.18, bronze in Greek Discus o- 7.13.
