



The Norman Martin trophy for the best performance at the club championships by an over 70 went to thrower Colin Brand, with a shot putt of 10.25. The first Jim Day trophy for best pole vault performance at any time in 2010 was won for the third year running by Sue Yeomans, with a European record of 2.86 at age 57, the best overall percentage grade of 97.27, and the second for the best performance at the SCVAC 10k championship by W45 Tina Oldershaw, 36:58.



The new Alf Woods trophies for best performances at the 2010 club championships were won by sprinters Ray Watkins, 100m in 12.43 at age 57, 93.08%, and 63 year old Brenda Fee, 100m in 15.45. The middle distance awards were taken by Ken Daniel, a 2:24.60 800m at age 59, and Sharon Hawkins, 5000m in 19:01.36. Neil Griffin, a shot putt of 13.46 at age 62, and Liz Sissons, for a 9.47 putt, took the throwers' awards. Trevor Wade, who long jumped 5.53 at age 54 and Sue Yeomans, with her second trophy of the evening for a 2.70 pole vault, another over 90% score, 91.83, were the winning jumpers

**BMAF Cross Country Championships

The course of 2km laps was mainly flat, but there was a slight incline at the back of the course into a headwind. Unlike in 2009 for the British and Irish Masters race when it was wet and boggy, the course was very dry and likened to a "Park Run" by some. For the first time there were just 2 races, with the M65+ running 3 laps (6K) with the women. Men 35-64 ran 4 laps (8K). Everyone raced in 5 year age bands.

There were some excellent performances and new member Lucy Elliot won the ladies race outright and a Gold Medal for 1<sup>st</sup> W45! **Gold medals were also won by:-** Michael Desmond M60 John Batchelor M70. **Silver medals were won by:-** Julia Austin W45 Paul Fernandez M35 Norman Morrison M60 Geoff Newton M65 John Goulding M75. **Bronze medals were won by:-** Brenda King W65 David Parsons M60 John Steed M75. Once again we must thank Blackheath and Bromley Harriers AC for allowing us to incorporate our SVAC Championships within their open race. There is a special feel to this event, which attracts club athletes back year after year. There may possibly be an alternative future venue, in Norman Park and some of the surrounding country, avoiding roads as far as possible. It would be a shame to see this race moving off-road, but understandably the organisers are mindful of safety considerations.

The earlier start time of 10 am proved a popular change, and the runners had a pleasant breeze to cool them down. SVAC runners accounted for 22 of the 167 finishers: this was a much better turnout than we had last year.

There were several fine SVAC performances, including M40 Spencer Hemsted, and M45 Viesturs Dude and David Weekes, who all placed in the top 10 of the open race. F45 Clare Elms was an impressive winner of the open women's race, and M70 winner John Batchelor ran an outstanding 42.25.

Congratulations to all who ran well, and well done the five M70 runners who made up our most populous age category – an inspiration to us all to keep competing!

## **SCVAC INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS LEE VALLEY 20.02.11-**

### **Allan Williams breaks M55**

#### **British pole vault record!**

The championships attracted an entry of about 200, similar to the 2009 and 2010 entries and acted as a good warm up for the BMAF championships later in the month and the Veterans Indoor Championships in Gent, Belgium, in March. Eleven championship best performances were beaten or equalled.

There was a large entry in the sprints. In the 60m M40 event guest John Corr and Joe Appiah ran a closely contested race, John just pipping Joe, with both athletes clocking 7.4. John Browne ran a fast 7.7 to take the M55 title and Terry Bissett the M65 in 8.6. Joan Trimble ran an impressive 8.9 to take the W55 title. John Corr had a second win in the 200m with 24.4, Pat Logan easily won the M50 race in 24.8 and Terry Bissett triumphed again in 28.1, as did Joan Trimble with a 30.7 clocking. The outstanding athletes in the 400m races were easy winners M45 Jonathan Tilt with 53.8 and M50 Kermit Bentham with 54.5, CBP, and Terry Bissett 66.0, also a CBP.

The middle distance races were less well supported, but impressive 800m runs came from Steve Baldock, 2:04.7 in the M40 race and Jonathan Tilt, 2:09.2 and guest Michael Bridgeland ran a speedy 9:34.1 to win the M50 3000m. The outstanding 3000m walker was international medallist John Hall with an impressive 15:16.5 clocking in the M60 group. Joe Appiah ran 8.6 to win the M40 60m hurdles with Barry Ferguson taking the M65 event easily in 10.7.

In the field events the performance of the day was Allan Williams' British record breaking 3.91 pole vault in the M55 age group. Chris Mills vaulted 4.41 to take the M35 title and

European record holder Sue Yeomans, W55, 2.70, =CBP, while W50 Teresa Eades vaulted 1.30, CBP. Three impressive long jumps came from M35 Neil Lincoln, 6.13, M50 Trevor Wade, 5.13 and W45 Imeta Barauskiene, 4.65, =CBP. Neil and Imeta stood out again in the triple jump with 12.05, CBP, and 10.17 respectively. Imeta took her third gold medal in the high jump with 1.45, CBP, while Gary Capon excelled with 1.60, CBP, and M60 Geoff Kitchener jumped 1.40, =CBP. International medallist Mark Wiseman impressed in the M40 shot with 15.47 as did W55 Vilma Thompson with 11.02.

### *We received the following news from John Goulding.*

Last year I joined the SWVAC and just before the BMAF Half Marathon I joined the SCVAC and I will be rejoining.

I thought my background to running might be of interest to the magazine. After playing football and then refereeing I decided at 50 yrs of age to join my local athletic club, the Andover Athletic Club and rekindle my love of running as a school boy. Road running and cross country were both enjoyed but my times were far from exceptional. However, as time passed I found I was moving up the Hampshire rankings, until in 200, aged 70, I won the Hants Championships at 10k, 10 mile and half marathon 44 mins 18 secs, 74 mins 56 secs and 1 hr 41 mins 13 secs respectively. It wasn't until my wife bought a lap top and started to research the times for over 75 yrs, which I was now approaching that I realised I could compete at a higher level.

After my 75th birthday on the 4th June I ran the 10k at Poole, finishing first over 70 and of course over 75 and in doing so broke the SWVAC record for over 75 (48 mins 24 secs). I then broke the half marathon record in the New Forest half in a time of 1 hr 51 mins 48 secs and then the 10 mile at Oldbury, Bristol in a time of 50 mins 41 secs while gaining a silver medal in the BMAF Championships last year.
