SCVAC TRACK AND FIELD LEAGUE FINAL ASHFORD – 7th September 2014

In ideal conditions, a warm and sunny day, with almost no wind, the winners of each division gathered to compete for the title of SCVAC team of the year.

In the men's match Cambridge Harriers led from the start, chased closely by Southampton, last year's winners, and Abingdon and Dartford Harriers, but pulled away to win by a substantial margin of 22.5 points over Abingdon in second place.

The sprints were dominated by Cambridge Harriers. Tony Noel won all three M50 events, 100m, 12.0, 200m, 24.3, and 400m, 54.14, with Dean Durant taking two M35 events, 100m, 12.0 and 200m, 24.9, and Doug Lucas winning the M60 200m. in 27.3. Simon Ciaravella won the M35 400m. for Southampton in 55.12.



Herne Hill and Barnet were the key players in the distance events. Herne Hill's M35 Simon Coombes won the 1500m. in 4:15.46 and the 3000m. in 9:06.78, Gary Ironmonger the M50 800m. in 2:16.1 and Mike Mann the M60 3000m. in 11:14.15. For Barnet Dave Wilcock easily took the M60 800m. in a fast 2:14.7, Richard McCormick the M50 3000m. in 9:43.64 and Steve Allen the M50 2000m.walk in 10:40.84. Jon Grainger won the M50 1500m, 4:50.90 for Southampton and Craig Sharp the M35 800m, 2:05.2, for Dartford.

Honours were more widely shared in the jumps. Southampton's Mark West won the M35 high jump, 1.55 and Vic Novell, the man who clinched the title for Southampton last year, the M60 long jump with 4.25. Epsom and Ewell's David Blunt, M60, won the high jump, 1.40, and the M50 pole vault, 3.00, with his colleague John Andrews winning the M35 event with 3.70. Cambridge Harriers' M35 Dean Durant

won long and triple jumps, 6.22 and 12.03 and Pete Stepney for Abingdon took the M50 triple, 10.22.

In the throws Cambridge Harriers were outstanding, with two double winners, M35 Andy Kruszenski winning discus and shot, 39.02 and 11.19 and Tony Tipping, M50, taking the hammer and shot, 44.94 and 11.24. Chris Melluish added the M60 hammer in 30.87. Dartford prevailed in the javelin, Richard Nash taking the M35 with 42.54 and John Fenton the M50 with 43.24, while for Abingdon Steve McCourt won the M35 hammer with 31.63 and Ron Jones the M60 shot with 9.84. Herne Hill's Garry Power scored their only field event win in

the M50 discus, 41.89. Southampton won both relays, holding off Dartford, but not quite by enough to hold on to third place in the final table.



In the sprints Diana won the 400m. A race in a fast 60.49 with Julia taking the B race in 62.68 and the B 100m. in 14.1. Sue Wisdom won the W50 200m, 31.7, to complete Epsom and Ewell's victories. Cambridge Harriers' Xanine Powell, W35, won both 100m. and 200m. races, 13.7 and 28.5, while for Blackheath and Bromley M60 Helen Godsell took the W50 100m, 14.7 and the W60 200m, 30.4. Catkin Shelley from Serpentine won the W50 400m. in 71.26.

The distance events were dominated by Cambridge Harriers, with W50 world record holder Claire Elms easily winning three events, 800m, 2:48.91, 1500m, 5:10.06 and

In the women's match Cambridge Harriers took an early lead, but were soon overhauled by Epsom and Ewell, last year's winners. Cambridge and Blackheath and Bromley kept close to Epsom and Ewell for most of the match, but in the final stages Epsom and Ewell extended their lead to a significant 17 points.

W35 sisters Julia Machin and Diana Norman played a leading role in Epsom and Ewell's victory. Each sister competed in six events, with five wins and one second place, so contributing 41 points each to the team total. And by competing in the relays, both won by Epsom and Ewell, the pair helped to add further team points.



3000m, 11:11.87, while another international star M60 Ros Tabor again easily won her age group races, 800m, 2:58.39 and 3000m, 12:36.19. Back with Epsom and Ewell Diana Norman won the 800m. and 1500m., 2:15.5 and 5:12.58 and added a second place in the 3000m, 11:42.17. The 2000m. walk produced victories for Serpentine's Pam Rutherford, W35, 13:13.9 and Blackheath and Bromley's Anne Cilia, W50, 13:53.0.

Epsom and Ewell and Blackheath and Bromley were the most successful clubs in the jumps, Julia Machin winning high and triple jumps, 1.65 and 10.34, Diana Norman the long jump,



5.12, and Charmaine Johnson the W50 high jump, 1.40, while for Blackheath and Bromley Jackie Montgomery and Helen Godsell won two events apiece, Jackie taking the W35 pole vault with 2.60 and the W50 long jump, 4.03, and Helen Godsell the W60 high and long jumps, 1.07 and 3.57. Avis Cowley put Herts Phoenix in the picture with her 6.29 triple jump to win the W50 category.

The six victories in the throws continued the Epsom and Ewell supremacy, a clean sweep in all shot events, Julia, W35, 10.01, Charmaine, W50, 10.83 and Liz Sissons, W60, 8.60. The club also won both javelin events, Diana with 32.37 and Charmaine with 24.91, while Wendy Dunsford won the W50 hammer, 29.62. The other throws successes came from Serpentine in the hammer, W35 Mary Davies, 21.57 and W60 Jan Farmer, 22.75, from Cambridge in the discus, Helen Daniel, W35, 28.92 and Lynn Atkinson, W50, 20.08 and from Jackie Montgomery for 151

Blackheath and Bromley in the W35 hammer, 15.51.

EAMA INTER AREA CHALLENGE SOLIHULL – 21st July 2014

Four British records and 31 CBPs

In ideal warm and sunny conditions, with almost no wind, the match again this year was held in a highly competitive, but very friendly atmosphere, with some performances of a very high standard. Four British records were set. Four Southerners set two, Moira West beating Angela Copson's mark to break the W65 400m. with 73.48, and Moira, with Helen Godsell, Linda



In the men's match SCVAC were dominant in the sprints. Joshua Wood won the M35 100m. and 200m, 11.38 and 23.45, Ray Watkins the M60 200m. and 400m, 26.16 and 57.38, Terry Bissett the M70 200m. and 400m, 29.73 and 66.81 and the M60 team took the 4x100m. relay. M35 Mensah Elliott added the 110m. hurdles in 15.72. The distance men were most successful at 800m. and 1500m. In the 800m. Craig sharp ran a fast 2:02.29 to win the M35 race easily. Dave Wilcock took the M60 race in 2:18.73 and John Batchelor won the M70 in 2:46.04. Dave scored a double by winning the Ahmet and Viv Bonner clocking 59.78 to break the long standing W60 4x100m, record set by the British team in the 2001 world championships in Brisbane. SWVAC's Neil Tunstall reduced his own M50 100m. hurdles record by one hundredth of a second to 14.39 and Kevin Murch, MMAC, also improved his own M50 javelin mark with 54.47. There were 31 CBPs, the successful SCVAC athletes being Terry Bissett (2), Ray Watkins, Dave Wilcock, John Batchelor, Diana Norman, Helen Godsell, Liz Sissons and two relay teams, W60, of course, and M60. A closely contested match led finally to a win for MMAC in the men's match, for SCVAC in the women's match and an overall victory for MMAC.



1500m. in 4:38.4 and M35 Adrian Haines was only narrowly beaten by EVAC's Luke Humphries, taking second place in 4:16.32. To complete the track successes Chris Hobbs won the M50 2000m. walk in 10:02.24.

In the long jump Andy Lewis won the M35 in 6.34, Trevor Wade, returning from a lengthy period of injury, took the M50 category with 4.72, while Keith Newton won the triple, 12.27 and M50 decathlete Allan Leiper vaulted a winning 3.32. Thrower Neil Griffin, M60, won both shot and discus, 12.23 and 43.06, M35 Peter Mayfield took the javelin with 40.10, and was only narrowly beaten in the discus, recording 37.11, and M70 Brian Harlick scored a shot victory with 8.32.

In the women's match also the team scored well in the sprints. W35 Diana Norman won the 400m. in 59.25 and added the 80m. hurdles in 12.8, W50 Euphemia Scott won the 100m. in 14.18 and just lost out in the 200m, running 29.85 for second place. W60 Viv Bonner won the 100m. easily in 14.71 and W60 Helen Godsell the 200m. with 30.61. In the distance races W50 Caroline Wood had a





very satisfactory day, winning the 3000m. in 11:31.52 and, stepping down from her best distance, took second places in the 800m, 2:44.99 and 1500m, 5:30.07.

In the field SCVAC athletes performed best in the jumps, with Linda Ahmet tying for first place in the high jump with 1.10, Jackie Montgomery winning the W50 pole vault, 2.62, Amanda Rowley-Jones taking the W50 triple jump, 9.23 and Diana Norman scoring a double win to add to her track successes, high jump, 1.55 and triple jump, 10.03, plus another second place, in the long jump, 5.02. The team were weaker in the throws, with only a solitary victory, Liz Sissons, now 70, taking her age group shot with 8.16.

Diana Norman deserves congratulation as the athlete, male or female, gaining most points in the match, 46, four first places and two seconds.

British Record for John Seymour

John Seymour, just into the M80 category, ran a fine 400m. in 87.63 to break the British record by a large margin. 10 CPBs were set, John's, of course, and the rest by Teresa Eades (3), Sue Yeomans (2), Amanda Rowley-Jones, Neil Griffin, Barry Ferguson and Allan Leiper.

In the sprints the best performances in the 100m. races came from M60 Ray Watkins, a fast 12.82, M35 guest Stuart Channon, 11.80 and M70 Terry Bissett, 15.00. In the 200m. Ray again stood out, with 25.99, with Stuart clocking 23.80 and Terry 30.29. In the 400m. races John



Seymour was the outstanding athlete, and Ray put in a third excellent performance in 57.98. Good performances in the women's sprints came in the 100m. from W45 Michele Wakefield, 14.64, W50 Kirstin King, 14.35, W55 Joan Trimble, 14.88 and W60 Helen Godsell, 14.78. Joan, 31.26 and Helen, 30.69, kept up the good work in the 200m, while in the 400m. races, W50 Euphemia Scott ran 68.20, and W55 Lynn Talbot, 71.16.

In the distance events, Andrew Coleman, M45, ran a fast 800m. in 2:08.94, M60 Chris Reed a 5:45.29 1500m. and M65 Alan Davidson 3000m. in 23:48.69. M55 Malcolm Martin clocked 16:38.63 in the 3000m. walk and notable hurdles times came from M70 Barry Ferguson with his 80m, 15.46, CPB, M40 Peter Davey in the 110m, 16.81, Barry again in the 300m, 57.56 and M60 Geoff Kitchener, 54.56.

The jumps produced seven of the CBPs. On top form Teresa Eades, W55, long jumped 4.10, high jumped 1.30 and achieved 9.49 in the

triple, with W50 Amanda Rowley-Jones reaching 9.34 in the same event. W60 European record holder Sue Yeomans vaulted 2.70 in her main event and jumped 8.54 in the triple. In the men's events M50 Allan Leiper vaulted 3.50, CBP, M40 Neil Lincoln jumped a long 6.33 and was narrowly beaten by Steve Lake in the triple, Steve's 12.10 to Neil's 11.90. M50 Allan Leiper also high jumped 1.51 and M35 Chris Mills vaulted 4.00. The throws were another CBP area. Neil Griffin, M65, throwing the discus 44.51 and adding two other good performances, shot, 12.41, and hammer, 39.57. Tony Tipping, M50, had a successful day, with a 38.29 javelin throw, a 41.19 discus and a 13.06 shot. M70 Garry Negus recorded two impressive performances, 11.18 short and 38.01. hammer. M60 Tony Richards, threw a 34.77 discus and a 11.23 shot and Michael Bennett, also M60, a 38.29 javelin.

W60 Ann Bath, an ultra distance walker, turning to running events, had a very busy day, competing in 400m, 800m, 1500m, and 3000m, probably a doddle for someone who can keep walking for 24 hours in a track race!

Walter Hill won the open prize for M60, and Barbara Ralph of Chiltern Striders won F60, narrowly shading Keith and Walter for the best age graded performance by a Southern Counties Veterans AC member. The best BMAF age graded score was 82.94%, by Ann Doherty of Forres Harriers, aged 69 who ran 4:19:39.

SCVAC results in full: our members accounted for 50% of the BMAF finishers, and recorded some good performances in quite humid conditions for marathon running. Well done to you all – I enjoyed handing you your hard-won BMAF and SCVAC medals! efficiently processed through a taped off route of tables issuing race numbers, timing chips, age group numbers etc. Marshalls and feed stations were plentiful, and the enthusiastic announcer kept spectators entertained throughout the event.

The marathon runners started with those running half the distance, and the winning half marathon time of 1:19 illustrates the hilly nature of the first half of our championship course. There is also a testing hill two miles from the finish, climbing from Margate seafront up onto the clifftop path. Most finish times were 8 or 9 minutes slower than the runner's London Marathon result.

BMAF runners dominated the open race: M40 Peter Dimbleby of Birchfield was 1st, and M50 Keith Dowson of Sevenoaks was 3rd.
