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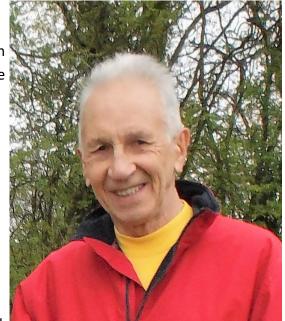

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HIGHLIGHTS FROM A.G.M. HELD 2nd DECEMBER 2016

- Our Chairman, Arthur Kimber, (pictured right), has been elected as a Life Vice President of BMAF. This prestigious award has been well earned by Arthur over many years of service not only for the BMAF but also for the SCVAC.
- The SCVAC Committee was confirmed and is shown on page3. The main changes relate to the positions of Secretary and Road Running Secretary as outlined separately in this issue. There is still a vacancy for someone to organise the outdoor track and field championships. These had to be combined with the VAC's championships last year for lack of an organiser and unless someone comes forward the club may be unable to have their own meeting again this year.



- Notwithstanding the problems associated the outdoor track and field championships, the indoor championships at Lee Valley were a great success with over 200 entries. The track and field league, and in particular the final, was again a success although there was a shortage of officials.
- The track and field fixtures for 2017 were outlined and are shown on the fixtures page. The road running schedule is outstanding pending the new Secretary's input.
- The annual subscription for membership has been raised to £20 in order for the club to maintain a healthy financial position.
- It was proposed that the Southerner, a major cost for the club, would only be available in hard copy to those who paid a subscription. A copy would remain on the club's website and perhaps transmitted to all members electronically. More details are outlined separately in this issue. (see page 6).
- The trophies were not awarded at the meeting. This was due to other commitments particularly the proximity of the World Track and Field Championships in Perth. These will be presented during the SCVAC indoor championships and the Inter Area Challenge at Lee Valley in February. Existing trophy holders are urged to return their trophies before or during these meetings.

SCVAC 10k Championship – Givaudan Ashford 10k, October 9th 2016

Race Director Barry Hopkins and his Sporting Events team laid on an immaculately organised race, despite this popular fixture being a sell-out, with no entries possible on the day. Some unexpectedly heavy showers caused a few puddles around the course, but conditions were good for running — cool with a few light showers.

First man home for SCVAC was Dominic O'Mahoney, third in the open race, and only edged out of second place by one second. Dominic, who achieved an 87.88% age graded performance, took home the trophy for 1st M40 in the open race. Other excellent performances were recorded by M45 Mark Champion, M55 Kevin Williams, and M75 Dave Moorekite, who all exceeded 83% age graded.

For the women, Ann Buckett was our first finisher – her husband Dave, who is the Chairman of Crawley A.C., kindly presented our medals at the SCVAC presentations.

EA Registration Reminder

A current UKA registration is now mandatory under UKA rules for BMAF affiliated members and GB-resident open members in order to compete in any BMAF championships.

About 10% of SCVAC members are not currently registered correctly with England Athletics. If you wish to compete in 2017 whether indoors or outdoors, please login and check your account details in the BMAF website.

If Section E is not coloured green, you need to check with the membership secretary of your first claim club. Possible causes include:

Your first claim subs may be overdue for the current year

Your first claim club has changed and EA have not been advised

Your first claim club have not yet paid the EA levy on your behalf

Etc.

Alternatively, you can be recorded as a non-competitor, in section D (BMAF Club Data) of your profile.

My name is Mark Champion, I'm 49 and my wife and I have both been members of Istead & Ifield Harriers for approaching 15 years. Apart from a couple of School Cross Countries I had no running pedigree and only got into running in my 30s, inspired by watching my wife take part in the Race for Life and the Cliffe Woods 10k

that came past our back door. Over the last 15 years I've been an active member of Istead & Ifield Harriers competing on the Roads, X-Country and was introduced to SCVAC by taking part in the Vets track league.

I've competed over all distances on the road completing about 10 Marathons but over the last few years I've got more heavily involved in track running competing over 1500, 3000 and 5000. I've also kept my road running to shorter distances and now rarely race distances above 10miles.

As I've got older I've gravitated more towards Masters Athletics and this has led me seek out the SCVAC & BMAF road races & to represent GB at Masters level. Indoors on the track at Torun Poland & Ancona Italy and on the roads in Lyon & Portugal, and at the moment I'm deep into training for the World Indoors in Daegu South Korea.



So when I was approached about the role of SCVAC Road Running secretary I thought it was a good opportunity to give something back to Masters Athletics. I look forward to meeting more of you over the coming months.

The Southern Counties Vets 10 mile road championships

These were held again this year in conjunction with Epsom and Ewell Harriers 10 mile road race on Sunday 13th November on Epsom Downs with the Epsom Racecourse Grandstand providing splendid facilities for all involved. Early morning fog shrouding the downs magically cleared about 10 minutes before the 0930 start time and we set off promptly under almost clear blue skies. The well marshalled route took us on an undulating anti-clockwise loop through Headley, Walton on the Hill and Tadworth finishing right alongside the Grandstand. Rather appropriately prizes were presented in the racecourse winner's enclosure. The main race was won by Scott Overall the England International Marathon runner with Southern Counties winners as follows:-

W40 - 1st Diana Norman 69.03 and also W40 winner in the main race.

W40 - 2nd Susan Aldridge 69.26

M55 - David Gill. 65.55

M60 - Neville Webb 70.50 and also M60 winner in the main race.

M65 - Mick Jefferies 86.28

M70 - Tony Rea 80.10 and also M70 winner in the main race.

M75 - 1st John Taylor 96.28

M75 - 2nd Patrick Dobbs 97.30

Richard Pitcairn Knowles world's oldest park runner to reach 250 milestone.



Richard, a long standing SCVAC member, has recently reached a unique milestone by becoming the oldest runner in history to run 250 Park Runs.

To mark the occasion he wrote a column for the Park Run website outlining his life in running and what the sport means for him and his family. Illustrating the fact that whatever one's age there is always a new target to aim for, he says that at present he leads the Run Britain rankings for his age group for the mile leading the legendary (for some us of older runners) Bruce Tulloh.

Among his achievements that he outlines are completing the London Marathon in 2:51.02 (aged 51), running the London to Brighton in 1983 in 7 hours 6 minutes, contesting the South Downs 80 miles in 1985 in 14 hours 42 minutes and, by way of complete contrast, beating Chris Chataway (another legend) over 1500 meters in his late sixties.

Richard was also recently interviewed by Alan Newman, former (and much missed) athletics' correspondent for the Kent Messenger where his greatest achievement was given as his M65 team gold for GB in the World Masters cross country at Gateshead in 1999. However, Richard himself thought perhaps his best performance was being lapped by his grandson Bede in a Park Run last year! And this leads to perhaps Richard's greatest source of pride; the involvement of his family in the sport. His son Mark (another member of SCVAC) his wife Lucy and their three children, Ellen, Polly and Bede all regularly represent their club, Tonbridge AC as well as partaking in Park Runs around the country. Richard's wife Pamela while not a regular runner (her preferred sport is tennis) has followed him around the world on his athletic journey.

Richard is also a keen supporter of the Last Friday 5K championship run monthly in Hyde Park, a popular series with veteran athletes as the championship is decided on age grading. Organised by the indefectible Malcolm French from Serpentine RC the series has run from 1998. Richard was the overall championship V80 winner in 2012 and 2013, V75 winner in 2009 and V70 winner in 2007 and says he is looking forward to becoming the V85 champion!

Recollections of WMA Championships, Perth 2016

I planned combining the Perth marathon with a three weeks holiday taking in Sydney, Ayers Rock, and Melbourne (where my brother lives). A chest infection disrupted training for seven weeks. With three weeks left I managed two 12 mile "long runs", and reduced my target to finishing inside 4 hours.

It was good to meet up with SCVAC members including Arthur Kimber. I cheered him in his heat of the 400m, and helped him pin up his GB relay teams on the notice board. Another team manager, Archie Jenkins, ran his 1500m heat, then dashed off to the WACA to watch the 1st day of the Test Match between Australia and South Africa.

The West Australians were very friendly hosts. The stadium commentator was knowledgeable and entertaining, and drew the crowd's attention to outstanding athletes of all nationalities. The GB team's fine performances have been reported elsewhere, so I'll just describe my marathon experience. The traffic free course of 2 half marathon laps used tarmac paths on both sides of the Swan River, crossing the river at the Narrows Bridge. On Saturday I dropped my personal drinks at the race HQ, across the river from the WACA. The 37 degrees heat luckily dropped on Sunday to a maximum of 26.



I shared a cab from the hotel at 5am with Tony Brackstone and Kevin Deakes, who were running the half marathon. There was a scrum at Race HQ – only one PC in use to register runners, and coloured wristbands to be worn (their purpose was not clear). The marathon start was delayed by about 20 minutes. I chatted with M65 team mates Ian Kitching and Francis Day. Ian had recent knee ligament problems, but Francis's training had gone well, with some 20 mile runs.

At the gun, Ian shadowed the favourite from Poland at around 7 minute miles pace, Francis settled into a 3:30 pace, and I shuffled off at 9 minute miles. I had prepared drinks with coloured labels to identify the contents, but a runner ahead helped himself to some of my attractive selection. I grabbed the water or electrolyte drink available at each feed station.

The half marathon started on time, and the leading runners whizzed past before the turning point at 10.5km. I shouted encouragement to Ian and Francis as they headed back up river. Australia were the only other team to worry about in our age group.

At 15km I caught an Australian M65 with a surname of Miller, who confirmed that he had been christened Keith after the Aussie cricketer. He moved ahead, and I stuck to my own pace. I reached halfway in 1:54, and ran 2 hours for the second half. Others slowed more, and I re-passed Keith Miller and other Australians, so despite my slowest ever marathon I finished happy. GB comfortably won the M65 team race, with Ian Kitching 2nd, Francis Day 4th, and me 6th. In the half marathon Tony Brackstone won a M70 team gold medal to add to his team silver in the cross country – well done Tony.

Australia is huge, and far away, but great fun to visit every time. I miss swimming in the sea off Manly, and my brother says it is 40 degrees in Melbourne. Time to nudge the thermostat up a notch and heat up that curry.

In very pleasant conditions, the SCVAC ladies ran as a team and could hardly have produced a better result by finishing first, third and fourth. Diana Norman won the race in a time of 27 mins 5 secs well clear of second place. Susan Aldridge, in third place, was only 6 seconds behind the second runner in 27 mins 53 secs with Lynne Champion close behind in 28 mins 4 secs. Ann Bucket, the only other SCVAC ladies runner also collected a race medal for third place in the W45 age group.



Mark Champion was the first male finisher for SCVAC in a time of 38 mins 33 secs. This put him in 11th place overall, and 2nd in the V40 age group. Meanwhile Colin Oxlade overcame Andrew Del Novo by only 8 seconds giving them 19th and 20th places respectively. They were both members of the 3rd scoring team, Croydon Harriers
